- Sat., 9/12 - 7:30 to 8 p.m.:** On grounds and in Arena, ceremonies dedicating the complex as War Memorial; short speeches by Governor Burns, Mayor Blaisdell, City Council Chairman Masato Doi.
- Sat., 9/12 - 8 p.m., Arena:** Art Linkletter's "Hollywood Party of the Stars;" a two hour variety show, Art Linkletter as Master of Ceremonies; Hollywood stars to include Allen Sherman, Richard Boone, Rhonda Fleming, Chuck Connors, Bob Cummings (others to be announced).
- Sun., 9/13 - 8 p.m.:** Brief Dedication Ceremony in Theater-Concert Hall. "Champagne Concert" with Metropolitan Opera star Dorothy Kirsten, soloist. Honolulu Symphony Orchestra conducted by George Barati. After Concert -- champagne for the house in quitably engraved "take home" champagne glasses.
- Tues., 9/15 - 8 p.m., Arena:** The "Isles of Paradise" Polynesian show from the Laie Polynesian Cultural Center. The music and dancing of all Polynesia from Hawaii to New Zealand by a cast of 250.
